#### Revitalization underway to enhance care for our community

# West Suburban Medical Center: Community Impact in 2021

- Partnered with University of Illinois, Chicago/ UI Health for Neurosurgery Services and Stroke/Tele-stroke Program.
- Achieved recognition as a Stroke Center of Excellence and as a Bariatric Center of Excellence, performing more than 250 bariatric cases annually.
- Achieved Senior-Friendly Emergency Department Certification.
- Purchased two state-of-the-art 3D tomography mammogram units for the River Forest Campus. Held a Community Open House to educate women about our advanced 3D tomography mammogram services.
- Hosted a Back-to-School event sponsored by the West Side Pastors' Coalition for AIDS and Inner City Health, distributing more than 100 backpacks filled with school supplies for children.



- Held a Prostate Cancer Screening event offering free PSA tests for the West Side/ Austin and Oak Park communities.
- Provided COVID-19 testing at the 5K Run for the Prevention of Violence in the Austin neighborhood.
- Provided \$112,879 in breast care services to the underserved at the River Forest Breast Care Center.
- Participated in the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program, serving 42 patients in FY2021 through the PCC Community Wellness Center.
- Named one of the top three maternity units in Illinois by The Leapfrog Group and Newsweek and one of the top 200 in the country.
- Participated in A Silver Lining Foundation partnership grant for screening mammograms and diagnostic services for 90 uninsured patients.
